Present Tense	I teach.	I am teaching.	I have taught.	I have been teaching.
Past Tense	I taught.	I was teaching.	I had taught.	I had been teaching.
Future Tense	I will teach.	I will be teaching.	I will have taught.	I will have been teaching.
